The meeting shall be a National Historic Race Meeting held under the FIA International Sporting Code including Appendices, the National Competition Rules (NCR) of the Confederation of Australian Motor Sport Ltd. (CAMS), The Race Meeting Standing Regulations (RMSR's), The Regularity Trial Standing Regulations, The Speed Event Standing Regulations and the Regulations for 5th Category Historic Cars, these Supplementary Regulations and any Further Supplementary Regulations, Bulletins and / or instructions issued for the Meeting.

6. ENTRIES | DETAILS

- a. Entries open on publication of these Regulations and close on **Friday 24th March 2017**. Entry fees are **\$330** per entry. Entries received without the correct entry fee will NOT be included in the acceptance process. **PLEASE NOTE:** As the CAMS member portal entry system is used to administer this event, entrants are asked to lodge entries at www.cams.com.au. Alternatively, traditional entry forms are available on the HSRCA website www.hsrca.com.
- b. Each entrant will receive 4 entry passes and 1 tender vehicle pass. **NOTE:** These passes will be available for collection from the HSRCA tent/office at the circuit from Friday morning. Circuit entry fees will not be charged before 8am on Saturday morning. Further weekend passes may be purchased along with the Entry at time of lodgement for a fee of \$20 each.
- c. CAMS Member Portal Event Entry or paper Entry Forms must be completed in full, accompanied by the correct payment and lodged prior to the close off date. The Organisers reserve the right to refuse any entry in accordance with **NCR83**. **PLEASE NOTE MAILING ADDRESS for paper entry forms and payments is as follows; Historic Spring Race Meeting / PO Box 5063 / Turramurra South, NSW 2074**
- d. All cheques (no cash through the mail, please) are to be made payable to the **Historic Sports & Racing Car Association of NSW Inc.** and are not considered received until honoured. A fee of \$50.00 will apply for a dishonoured cheque. Entry fees are non-refundable, except in accordance with the provisions of NCR 72.
- e. At the discretion of the organisers, a full refund, less an administration fee of \$50.00, may be given to withdrawals made prior to the event.
- f. All communication after receipt of entries will be by email or HSRCA website notice. Those without email access must advise the administrative secretary so that alternative arrangements can be made.

7. EVENTS

- a. It is proposed that over the two days of the Meeting, all cars will have one qualifying event plus at least three (3) Races.
- b. It is proposed that over the two days of the Meeting, Regularity competitors will have one practice event plus at least three (3) Trials.
- c. It is proposed that over the two days of the Meeting, Super Sprint competitors will have one practice event plus at least three (3) sprints.
- d. The program of events will be designed to give each group equal amount of track time and will be advised with the Further Supplementary Regulations.
- e. The program may include handicap races.
- f. **A minimum lap time of 1 minute 13 seconds will apply to regularity events** and if more than one regularity event is offered cars will be grouped by criteria that help to reduce risk

8. AWARDS

- a. Trophies will be awarded at the discretion of the Organisers.

9. SCRUTINY | PRACTICE | GRID

- a. Targeted scrutiny will be in operation at this event and vehicles that are part of this program are required to bring evidence of such to document check in the form of a documented log-book. Vehicles which are yet to have their initial targeted scrutiny audit will be required to undergo initial scrutiny.
- b. Scrutineering will take place at the circuit on Friday 7th April between 1:00pm and 4:00pm and on Saturday 8th April 2017 from 7:30am. Log books and Certificates of Description (where required) must be presented at the Scrutiny Bay. On Sunday 9th April 2017, a minimum of a safety check may take place.
- c. All vehicles, with regards to markings and numbers, must comply with Schedule K of the CAMS Manual of Motor Sport and
- d. Driver & Crew APPAREL shall be in accordance with Schedule D of the CAMS Manual of Motor Sport.
- e. Timed Qualifying / Practice will take place on Saturday only, and will be the qualifying basis for determining grid positions for the first race. Grid positions for subsequent races for all groups, excluding groups M & O, will be determined by the finishing order of the preceding race (with non-finishers and non-starters being added at the rear of the field at the discretion of the clerk of the course). Grid positions for Groups M & O will be determined by the fastest overall time by each competitor, in the preceding events, this will also apply where Groups M & O are combined with later Groups. The Organisers reserve the right to vary, combine, or add to practice sessions, subject to the approval of the Stewards.
- f. Each nominated driver (including Regularity & Super Sprint entrants) must complete a minimum three **(3) Timed laps** of practice. Drivers that fail to complete a qualifying session may compete at the discretion of the Clerk of the Course in accordance with CAMS Race Meeting Standing Regulation 5.2.

- g. Details of Practice times, together with Competitor Instructions and intended Schedule of Events, will be contained in Further Regulations issued for the Event.

10. LICENCES

- a. **Racing** drivers must hold a minimum of a current CAMS Provisional Clubman Circuit (PCC) Licence.
- b. **Regularity** and **Super Sprint** drivers must hold a minimum of a current CAMS Speed (level 2S) Competition Licence.
- c. **All** drivers must have proof of current membership of a CAMS affiliated Club which must be presented at Scrutiny.
- d. **No licences will be available for issue at the circuit.**
- e. All Licences, CAMS pass books, competition records, log books, COD's and membership cards must be presented at Scrutiny and also be available if required for inspection at any other time during the course of the Event.

Each Competitor must hold a CAMS Competition Licence as listed above unless they comply with (a) or (b) below.

(a) hold a Motor Sport New Zealand competition licence and Tasman Visa valid for the event; or

(b) hold a minimum of the highest grade National Licence issued by a foreign ASN together with an authorisation issued by that ASN for the event; each such Driver and Competitor:

(i) shall be ineligible to score points in any Championship/Cup/Series/Trophy/etc connected with the event; and

(ii) must receive an authorisation to compete from CAMS prior to the meeting;

The Organiser confirms that the circuit to be used for this meeting holds the necessary CAMS National Track licence for each of the events nominated in these Supplementary Regulations.

11. DRIVERS BRIEFING

Compulsory Driver's Briefing will be held Saturday 8:15am in Corporate Room near Pit Lane Exit. For details of penalties for non-attendance please refer to Race Meeting Standing Regulation 9.4 – Minimum Penalties.

12. CHANGE OF DRIVER

A change of driver may be permitted subject to NCR 143. **Secretary of the Meeting MUST be advised prior to any driver change.**

13. NOISE EMISSION / REQUIREMENTS

- a. All competing vehicles are subject to NCR 10.8 and must be fitted with an effective muffler **to NOT exceed** a noise level of **95dB (a)** on the standard 30 metre run-by test.
- b. **NOTE: The starting of competition vehicles prior to 8:00am is strictly prohibited.** This is the requirement of the circuit.

14. CHANGE OF PROGRAMME

The Organisers reserve the right to vary the programme of events under Race Meeting Standing Regulation 2.4, in the current CAMS Manual of Motor Sport, and under NCR 169 (xvi).

15. JUDGES OF FACT

- a. The Judges of Fact in respect of the start / finish and noise emission shall be the Clerk of the Course, Deputy and Assistant Clerks of the Course, Secretary of the Meeting, the Chief Timekeeper, the Chief Scrutineer, the Starter and Assistant Starters.
- b. Judge of Fact for pit lane speed and exceeding track limits will be notified by bulletin.

16. ABANDONMENT, POSTPONEMENT & CANCELLATION

The Organisers reserve the right to abandon, postpone or cancel the meeting at their sole discretion subject to NCR 59.

17. TIMING | LAP SCORING

- a. Timing will be by the Dorian electronic system ONLY and will be the official record of lap times and number of laps completed. A limited number of transponders will be available for hire, or purchase, at the circuit through Eldee Timing: Contact Lisa Drayton – 0413 055 114 or lisa@eldeetiming.com.au to make a booking. The **LAST LAP** board will be in use at this event.
- b. Details of the distribution of results will be published in the Further Regulations.

18. RACE STOPPAGE | RED FLAG

Should a race be stopped, by the use of the Red Flag, all vehicles are to return to the paddock. The next scheduled event will then be held. Should time permit, the Red Flagged race will be rescheduled and the grid will be determined in accordance with RMSR 6.13. Should the race not be restarted it shall be deemed to have finished and the results shall be in accordance with RMSR 6.13.

19. DRIVER BEHAVIOUR

All Drivers are subject to RMSR 7 Code of Driving Conduct and Article 2.1.3 Driver Behaviour of the 5th Category regulations. Should a driver be deemed to be in breach of these regulations, disciplinary action may be taken.

20. FUEL

Fuel must comply with Schedule G of the current CAMS Manual of Motor Sport. Refuelling of cars is not permitted in garages or carports. The maximum quantity of fuel that can be stored in garages and carports is 40 litres.

21. INSURANCE

- a. Certain public, property, professional indemnity and personal accident insurance is provided by CAMS in relation to the event. Further details can be found in the CAMS Insurance Handbook, available at www.cams.com.au.

22. PROTESTS

Any protests must be lodged in accordance with Part XII of the NCR.

23. GENERAL

- a. Any holder of a CAMS 'Competition' or 'Officials' licence (or equivalent licence issued by another ASN) may be tested for the presence of drugs (or other banned substances) and subject to a penalty(ies) for a breach in accordance with the CAMS Anti-Doping Policy and/or the CAMS Illicit Drugs in Sport (Safety Testing) Policy as published on the CAMS website. Consumption of alcohol in the paddock, pits or any section of the competition venue/course under the control of the Officials is forbidden until all competition is concluded each day. Accordingly, any holder of a CAMS 'Competition' or 'Officials' licence (or equivalent licence issued by another ASN) may also be tested for the presence of alcohol by a CAMS Accredited Testing Official (CATO) in accordance with the CAMS Standard Operating Procedure for Breath Alcohol Testing.
- b. **Pit lane speed limit shall be 40 kph.**

24. GARAGES | CARPORTS

- a. GARAGES / CARPORT will be available for hire at a cost of \$180 and \$130 respectively. Cars will be allocated to garages and carports according to their requirements and preferences as far as these can be done conveniently, whilst also giving preference interstate competitors and order of entry (first come, first served principle).
