

Changes for 2018:

In addition to applicants currently holding a National Circuit (NC) Licence, a HPL Endorsement will now be required for the following high performance 5th Category Historic vehicles:

- FIA Formula One and Indy Cars (all)
- F5000 (all)

Additionally, a National Circuit licence will be the minimum requirement for the following 5th Category Historic vehicle Groups:

- Groups Q and R FIA 2L Formula Two (2000cc)
- Group R Formula 3000/Formula Holden (all)
- Groups Q and R Sports over 2 Litre engine capacity
- FIA prototypes Group C1 and C2 Sports (all)

NOTE: International C/CH licence holders still require the endorsement to compete nationally. For more detail please follow these links:

HISTORIC RACING CAR CLUB (QLD) Inc MEMBERSHIP DEFINITIONS:

"Full Member is one who competes, Senior is discounted rate for Members who no longer compete in Motorsport."

(i) Category A - FULL Member:

A person who is <u>actively involved in motor sport</u>, for example but not limited to, a competitor, an entrant or an automobile preparer. *Full membership is required for CAMS Licence holders*.

Category A Members are entitled to notice of general meetings and to attend, vote and debate at general meetings.

Additional Family person who wishes to be a Category A· FULL Member of the HRCC, resides at the same address as a current financial Category A- FULL Member and the Family elect to receive ONE service (ie Newsletter, Oily Rag and Notices) from the HRCC, may join at the reduced fee under 'Additional FULL Family Member'. The current member will be the Primary member unless otherwise advised.

(ii) Category B - SENIOR Member:

A person who has <u>'retired from motor sport', i.e., no longer actively involved in motor sport</u> as is a Category A Member. Category B Members are entitled to notice of general meetings and to attend, vote and debate at general meetings. *This category does not relate to age or 'pension' status.*

(iii) Category C - SOCIAL Member:

Engine Sealing Compulsory for all Group N and S cars as of 1st January 2018

Are you aware that all competitors in Group N & S events held after 1st January 2018 will be required to have your engine sealed by a CAMS Approved engine sealer? This is a CAMS requirement, not a club requirement, in response to Competitors' requests to keep competition fair to all.

Sealing involves measuring the bore and stroke to confirm your engine capacity is within the class rules, then applying a wire and seal through a pair of sump bolts or engine block /sump flanges. This should be done when the engine is pulled down during its next rebuild. An engine can also be sealed prior to a refresh or rebuild on the proviso that at the next rebuild the seal is removed by a CAMS Historic Eligibility Officer (HEO) who will then measure the bore and stroke.

In the case of the engine being rebuilt or even the head removed the sealer can check the bore and stroke of your engine and apply seals to the sump after the measurements have been taken.

Normal component sealing for Rotarys or component substitution parts that already require sealing will not be affected by this additional requirement.

Once an engine has been checked then the competitor will be issued with a CAMS formal sealing document that is to be retained and must accompany the vehicle's logbook and be presented at race meetings if requested by the Historic Eligibility Officers.

Peter Herlihen will be available to measure and seal your engine by arrangement... He would ask that at least two sump bolts on each side of the engine block be drilled with at least a 2mm hole to accommodate the sealing wire. If the sump flange is able to be drilled then this would be preferable, again on either side of the sump.

No CAMS fee is set for the sealer's time but it would be appreciated if a monetary donation was made to the sealer to cover any out of pocket expenses that he may incur during the process. Seals and seal wire etc. will be the responsibility of the engine sealer to supply.

Peter can be contacted on 0438886053 for further details and any questions you may have.

Please consider this requirement if you intend to pull down your engine during the current Summer break.

For Groups N and S, since there are so many engines and so few authorised to measure and seal, it has been agreed that the seal will do for now, then when the engine needs work the seal can only be removed by an authorised sealer and the measuring done then. If found to be outside the rules, all competition results since the engine was sealed will then be void. After the work is completed, but before the head is fitted, the engine must be measured again and sealed.

Peter Herlihen will seal engines at Morgan Park on TTT day (Feb 17), Saturday only.

He will seal engines at Wednesday practice days at MPR, if given prior notice. Mob 0414 474 408.

HRCC will bring Peter to Brisbane one Saturday for sealing at John Tupicoff's Workshop 4/ 1472 Boundary Rd Wacol, date TBA, possibly March 3. We have a hoist if necessary, but we suggest, to save time on the day you pre-drill holes in an accessible place and if possible, accessible while on your trailer, saves you unloading. There is plenty of turnaround room on the site and all concrete paved.

CAMS Technical Commissioner and former HRCC President, Bruce Richards has asked me to publish the Standing Regulations for Regularity, as a gentle reminder of the Competitor's responsibilities, especially in regard to car preparation and log book (for those whose cars have them) requirements...see Reg 8.

REGULARITY TRIAL - STANDING REGULATIONS -2017 CAMS Manual of Motor Sport



1. PREAMBLE.

The purpose of a Regularity Trial is to set consistent lap times at less than the full potential of the driver and vehicle. It is not a race

It provides an opportunity for drivers to compete in a different style of speed event with less vigour than racing. For Historic motor sport, the showcasing of vehicles in this form of competition is an important aspect of maintaining and demonstrating Australia's motoring history.

Regularity Trials rely on the good judgement of the Organiser in accepting appropriate entries.

2. SPECIAL CONDITIONS

Driving in a manner designed to achieve positional advantage over another vehicle is not acceptable. Passengers are not permitted.

3. ASSEMBLY OF A FIELD

The Organiser shall assemble each field based on lap times, vehicle type or category. Due consideration shall be given to avoiding widespread disparity in vehicle type, category, lap time, maximum speed, closing speed and driver experience.

For 5th Category competition the relevant Group Compatibility Chart shall apply.

REGULARITY TRIAL - STANDING REGULATIONSContinued

4. NOMINATION OF MINIMUM LAP TIME BY THE ORGANISER

The Organiser shall nominate a minimum lap time for each field taking into consideration factors used to assemble a field and an allowance for a driver to 'break' their nominated lap time without compromising the safety of the trial. Subject to the approval of the Stewards, on the recommendation of the Clerk of the Course, the Organiser nominated minimum lap time may be varied.

5. NOMINATION OF LAP TIME BY DRIVER

Prior to each trial, in accordance with the Supplementary Regulations, each driver shall nominate a lap time. The driver nominated lap time shall be greater than the Organiser nominated minimum lap time and within 130% of each other driver nominated lap time in that field. The Organiser shall refuse a driver nominated lap time if it is deemed inappropriate. In such a case, the driver shall be required to nominate a lap time acceptable to the Organiser.

Where the variation of driver nominated lap times for a field exceeds 130% the following shall apply:

Regrouping of vehicles into other fields; or

Subject to the approval of the Stewards, on the recommendation of the Clerk of the Course, accepting a driver nominated lap time exceeding 130% for that field.

Subject to the approval of the Stewards, on the recommendation of the Clerk of the Course, a driver who fails to take part in the Official Practice or who fails to nominate a lap time shall be allowed to compete.

6. SCORING

Each lap for each vehicle shall be timed.

For each lap time which varies from the driver nominated lap time, a points penalty as specified in the Supplementary Regulations shall apply. The penalty for each lower lap time shall be two times the penalty for each greater lap time. The winner shall be the driver who has completed the required number of laps and has accrued the fewest penalty points. Once a driver has completed the required number of laps no further scoring for that driver shall apply.

A driver who records a lap time lower than the Organiser nominated minimum lap time shall be shown the black flag and excluded from that trial. Repeated lap times lower than the Organiser nominated minimum lap time may result in the driver being excluded from the event. This includes any extra laps that a driver may complete after the required number of laps.

7. TRACK DENSITY

The maximum track density shall be as listed on the track licence.

8. ELIGIBLE VEHICLES

Each vehicle shall comply with Schedule A and B.

(ii) A Regularity Trial for Historic vehicles may include any vehicle of a type suitable for inclusion in the 5th Category. Where a vehicle is the subject of a Historic Log Book, it shall comply with that Log Book. A replica 5th Category vehicle may be accepted provided it is clearly listed and identified as such in the entry form and entry list.

The inclusion of other vehicles in a Regularity Trial for Historic vehicles may be permitted, subject to approval by CAMS. (iii) Cruise control systems and on board timing devices shall not be used.

9. START PROCEDURE

For each field each vehicle shall be marshalled in order of driver nominated lap time, with the vehicle with the fastest driver nominated lap time at the front.

Prior to the commencement of each trial a one-minute board shall be shown to the field. A driver failing to be marshalled when the one-minute board has been shown shall not be permitted to commence that trial.

Each vehicle shall then enter the circuit in single file for a warm-up lap. During the warm-up lap each vehicle must remain in single file. Timing for each vehicle shall commence as it crosses the control timing line at the end of the warm-up lap (flying start) and shall continue until the display of the chequered flag.

Any variations to the start procedure must be approved by CAMS.

10. LICENCE REQUIREMENTS

Each Driver shall hold a minimum of a CAMS Speed Licence (formerly CAMS Level 2 Speed licence) and membership of a CAMS affiliated car club.

The Organiser may require a higher level of licence/experience.

11. SAFETY EQUIPMENT - APPAREL

Each Driver must wear apparel in compliance with Schedule D. The use of a full-face helmet when driving an open vehicle is highly recommended.

The Organiser may require a higher level of apparel.

12. VEHICLE LOG BOOKS

The requirement for a Vehicle Log Book is specified in Schedule L.

13. MARKINGS ON VEHICLES

Any markings on a vehicle, including competition number, must comply with Schedule K.

14. DRIVING STANDARDS

Each Driver shall comply with the Code of Driving Conduct of the Race Meeting Standing Regulations.

If the Clerk of the Course deems a driver to be driving in a dangerous or inappropriate manner he may refer the driver to the Stewards with a recommendation that the driver be excluded from taking any further part in the event.

The Organiser may specify a higher level of driving standard, eg; a no overtaking zone.
