The meeting shall be a National Historic Race Meeting held under the 2019 FIA International Sporting Code including Appendices, the 2019 National Competition Rules (NCR) of the Confederation of Australian Motor Sport Ltd. (CAMS), The 2019 Race Meeting Standing Regulations (RMSR's), the 2019 Regularity Trial Standing Regulations, the 2019 Speed Event Standing Regulations and the 2019 Regulations for 5th Category Historic Cars, the Supplementary Regulations, these Further Supplementary Regulations, Bulletins and / or instructions issued for the Meeting.

6. PROVISIONAL LICENCE HOLDERS

It is your responsibility to leave your licence with the Secretary of the Meeting or their representative who will forward it to the Clerk of the Course for endorsement towards your Clubman Circuit or National Circuit licence.

7. DRIVERS BRIEFING

A compulsory Driver Briefing FOR ALL DRIVERS will be held Saturday, 28th September 2019 at 8:15am at the Corporate Centre (near the Marshalling area). All Drivers MUST attend and sign. Failing to do so will result in the appropriate penalty.

8. START PROCEDURE

(a) All Races: Cars for all races will assemble in the numbered bays in the Marshalling Area and will move onto the Circuit for one (1) warm up lap before taking up their allocated position for a massed grid start. The starter will indicate approximately 5 seconds before the red lights are switched on. At a time between 3 and 5 seconds after the red light is shown, the start of the race will be indicated by the extinguishing of the red lights. **A green flag or light will not be shown.**

(b) Regularity Events (Refer Paragraph 8 of the Regularity Trial Standing Regulations): For each field each vehicle shall be marshalled in order of Driver nominated lap time, with the vehicle with the fastest Driver nominated lap time at the front. Prior to the commencement of each trial a one-minute board shall be shown to the field. A Driver failing to be marshalled when the one-minute board has been shown shall not be permitted to commence that trial.

Each vehicle shall then enter the Circuit in single file for a warm-up lap. During the warm-up lap each vehicle must remain in single file. Timing for each vehicle shall commence as it crosses the control timing line at the end of the warm-up lap (flying start) and shall continue until the display of the chequered flag.

9. TRACK CONTROL & SIGNALLING

Track Control & Signalling for all on track events will be in accordance with Appendix H of the current CAMS Manual of Motorsport. Lights may be in use at this meeting and will have the same authority as flags.

10. FUEL REFUELLING / STORAGE

Fuel must comply with Schedule G of the current CAMS Manual of Motor Sport. **Unleaded fuel WILL be available at the Circuit.** The use of LEADED FUELS IS NOT PERMITTED.

Storage: At any time the maximum quantity of fuel stored in containers in the garages or carports is 40 litres.

Refuelling of cars is not permitted in garages or carports

11. COOLING SYSTEM CATCH TANKS

Cars without cooling system catch tanks will be required to prove the vehicle is not using a Glycol based inhibitor, or any inhibitor that may leave the track slippery.

12. REGULARITY RESULTS

- i. One (1) point will be added for every tenth of a second more than the nominated time and two (2) points added for every tenth of a second below the nominated time for each lap. The winner will be the Driver who has completed the required number of laps and accrued the fewest penalty points.
- ii. The winning team for the Regularity Endurance will be the team that completes the closest number of laps to their nominated totals.

13. SUPER SPRINT RESULTS

(a) The winner will be the Driver who records the shortest elapsed time for the duration of the sprint, inclusive of any penalties applicable.

(b) In the case of a tie in such shortest elapsed time, the next fastest official lap time shall be taken into account, and so on until individual places are determined. No account will be taken of practice runs

14. CODE OF DRIVING CONDUCT

- i. **Competitors are reminded** of 5th Category Regulations – Historic Cars – Events, Article 1.3 "Driver Behaviour" and Article 7 of the Race Meeting Standing Regulations in the current CAMS Manual of Motor Sport and should be aware the Clerk of the Course has the authority to impose a **pit lane drive through penalty** and or **time penalties** for any perceived breaches.
- ii. **It is compulsory for all drivers involved in any contact** during the course of an event to report to the Clerk of the Course or their representative immediately after that event.

15. MAXIMUM VEHICLE SPEED IN THE PADDOCK

No vehicle, competition or otherwise (including bicycles), may exceed a speed of 10kph whilst travelling in the Paddock Area.

16. GENERAL

(a) All COMPETITORS in all CLASSES, including Regularity and Super Sprint, are reminded that all HISTORIC CARS must comply with the provisions of **Schedule K (Markings on Automobiles) and 5th Category Regulations-Historic Cars-Vehicle Eligibility-General Requirements Articles 1.3 and 1.4** regarding advertising and competition numbers under the General Requirements in the current CAMS Manual of Motor Sport.
